The sport premium is to be used to increase the quality & breadth of PE & Sport provision, and increasing participation in PE & Sport. At Ebchester School, we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils.

In addition, we believe that an innovative and varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all children. Below is a breakdown of how we propose to spend the Sports Premium Funding for the academic year 2019/20

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| To promote physical activity through a wide and varied range of sports-based experiences for all pupils. | Each half term, children will have the opportunity to try a new and 'different' sporting activity. E.g. climbing, yoga, canoeing etc As well as promoting active lifestyles, this will add to childrens' experiences, perhaps prompting them to take up the activity outside of school. £5,000 | Children have engaged extremely well with the range of sporting experiences offered so far. <i>*There have been 3 activities up to now: Yoga, trampolining and fencing.</i> £860 |
