Sports Premium 2020-21

The sport premium is to be used to increase the quality & breadth of PE & Sport provision, increasing participation in PE & Sport. At Ebchester School, we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils. In addition, we believe that an innovative and varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all children. Below is a breakdown of how we propose to spend the Sports Premium Funding for the academic year 2020/21. Due to the Covid-19 situation, £10,228 has remained unspent from the 19/20 academic year.
