

### Sports Premium 2021/22

The sport premium is to be used to increase the quality & breadth of PE & Sport provision, increasing participation in PE & Sport. At Ebchester School, we strive to promote healthy and active lifestyles and aim to provide sporting opportunities for all our pupils. In addition, we believe that an innovative and varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all children. Below is a breakdown of how we propose to spend the Sports Premium Funding for the academic year 2021/22. Due to the Covid-19 situation, £10,228 has remained unspent from the 19/20 academic year.

It has been noted that the equipment doesn't last very long before it is lost or broken – need to improve collection and storage of equipment at the end of break. Curriculum PE equipment has been purchased to ensure all aspects of the NC can be taught effectively. Staff report that there are no gaps in equipment.

All children access weekly FS sessions which receives very positive feedback from staff and pupils. These sessions can continue into the next academic year. Orienteering course has been drawn up by the Northern Navigators Orienteering Club. The orienteering club led an activity day for all pupils to experience orienteering. Staff now have access to maps but in order for orienteering activities to take place every year (without buying in additional support), control punches and marker packs will need to be purchased. There are enough waterproofs for all infant pupils – these will need to be replaced after the 2022/23 academic year.
